Towns and Villages

Rich in American heritage, the seven towns and numerous villages of Loudoun have friendliness and charm that offers the perfect escape from life's everyday routine. Loudoun is home to National Historic Landmarks, annual fairs and festivals and Civil War sites. Each town has a pleasant streetscape unveiling its history. Loudoun's most popular visitor destinations are the town of Leesburg, the county seat, and Middleburg, the unofficial capital of horse country.



Heritage

In our backyard lies the history of America. Loudoun County is in the center of The Journey Through Hallowed Ground, a 180-mile scenic and historic corridor stretching from Jefferson's Monticello near Charlottesville, Virginia, to Gettysburg, Pennsylvania.

Today, 19th-century plantations and Civil War battlefields still exist in Loudoun for visitors to touch a piece of America's history. In Leesburg, Morven Park is a 1,000-acre estate that was the home of a Virginia governor. It features a Greek Revival-style mansion, the Museum of Hounds and Hunting, a horse-drawn carriage collection, recreated Civil War camp and boxwood gardens. Ball's Bluff Battlefield is the site of the second largest Civil War battle fought in Loudoun and features a one-mile hiking trail loop with interpretive signs and a national cemetery.



Recreation and Golfing

The great outdoors of Loudoun County is waiting for you to take advantage of what it has to offer. Hike scenic parks, bike the old W&OD trail, which is now a 45-mile paved multi-use recreational trail, go horseback riding or just take in some fresh air.

Bring your passion and awaken your game to the holes of championship golf in Loudoun, where many courses are designed by golf professionals like Greg Norman and Gary Player. Enjoy gorgeous scenery and pro-golf shops with experienced professionals.
